Brett Gray reported that COMB has an agreement with the property owner to do some drainage construction which would improve the drainage from the property and direct it into the main debris basin at Lauro Reservoir. The property owners are waiting for the permits to be issued before construction work can begin.

6. Resolution No. 451 Commemorating Robert Dunlap's Thirty Years of Service

The Board postponed action on this item until the January 22, 2007 meeting; Mr. Dunlap was unable to attend the December 18th meeting.

7. Lauro Dam Safety of Dams Project

a. Draft Habitat Mitigation Plan

The Lauro SOD Project required a Habitat Mitigation Plan for vegetation that was impacted or removed during construction. Brett Gray had included a draft Vegetation Plan for Lauro Dam in the Board packet which was prepared by URS. There are approximately 40 oaks trees being replanted along with native shrubs and

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grasses. Areas of the dam structure need visual inspection from time to time, therefore those areas need to be planted with native grasses and the oaks and shrubs planted in the remaining locations. The plan is currently being reviewed and has been conceptually approved by COMB and Reclamation. The final plan is not expected to change from the draft plan.

Resolution No. 452 Regarding Repayment of Lauro Dam SOD Contract No. 05-WC-20-2923

At the November 20, 2006 meeting, Santa Ynez River Water Conservation District ID#1 had requested that a document be prepared stating that ID#1 would not be obligated to pay any part of the repayment for the Lauro Dam SOD Project under Contract No. 05-WC-20-2923 because it was a project that benefited the South Coast Member Units only. COMB Counsel was of the opinion that a resolution stating that the four South Coast Member Units were responsible for the total repayment cost and that ID #1 would not be obligated to pay any part of the repayment obligations was the most appropriate document to achieve the desired outcome. However, ID#1 thought, although the resolution was a good start, it lacked the security ID#1 was looking for because it did not provide enough protection for them; it could be rescinded by future Boards, and it did not include sufficient indemnification of ID#1. They had expected an MOU to be prepared.

Director Abel called the question on Resolution 452, seconded by Director Williams. Following discussion Director Abel asked Director Loudon if ID#1 would like to withdraw consideration of Resolution 452 at that time. Director Loudon requested that Mr. Hair and Mr. Kvistad further discuss which sort of document would be most appropriate to protect ID#1's interests and bring this item back to the Board at the January 22, 2007 meeting. Director Abel withdrew the motion to call the question.

Director Williams moved to continue the item to the January 22, 2007 meeting, seconded by Director Abel, passed 6/0/1, Director Lieberknecht absent.

8. Lauro Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project

Ms Rees reported that the Ad Hoc Committee consisting of Directors Evans and Williams, Kevin Walsh and Steve Mack had met and evaluated the project, and that all expressed support of the Lauro Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project. On December 12, 2006 COMB staff presented an overview of the Lauro Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project to the Goleta Water District Board (GWD). At that meeting, Director Evans reported to the GWD Board that he is ready to move forward with this project.

Included in the Board packet was an overview of the Lauro Debris Basin Project, the new concept design, the estimated cost and the percent distribution for the South Coast Member Units. The COMB audit for FY 2005-06 identified excess revenues of approximately \$560,000. Staff requested that the Board approve the project and set

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aside those excess funds for the Lauro Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project to pay for final design, environmental compliance and permitting work, and partial funding for construction of the project.

Director Williams moved that the Board approve adding the Lauro Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project as a special project to the FY 2006-07 budget at a cost of \$560,000, designate the unexpended funds from FY 2005-06 to the Lauro Debris Basin Rehabilitation Project and authorize procurement of bids from pre-selected contractors for construction of the project, seconded by Director Abel, passed 5/0/2, Director Loudon abstained and Director Lieberknecht was absent.

9. Disposition of Excess Funds From FY 2005-2006

The recommendation from item #9 was discussed and included in the motion made by Director Williams during item #8.

10. Development of Integrated Regional Water Management Plan

Ms Rees highlighted the information included in the Board packet. Included were meeting minutes and agendas from the Partner's meetings held during the last month and the review draft of submitted projects. Ms Rees explained the process by which the submitted projects were being incorporated into the Plan. It is expected that the Plan will be ready for the various Boards approval in March 2007

11. Cachuma Project Renewal Master Contract Interest Rate Adjustment.

a. Counsel's Opinion Letter Regarding COMB Board's Approval of Revised M&I Interest Rate

Included in the Board packet was Counsel's opinion letter concerning the ability of the Board of Directors of COMB to act on behalf of its Member Units to accept the interest rate modification proposed by Reclamation pursuant to a term in COMB's Joint Powers Agreement. ID#1 thought the action taken by the COMB Board was not legally valid or appropriate, and indicated by letter that they believed an amendment to the Renewal Master Contract was necessary. COMB Counsel advised the Board that the interest rate adjustment was an administrative action that was negotiated with Reclamation, and that it did not necessitate amending the Renewal Master Contract. Ms Rees reported that she had met with Kirk Rodgers, Mid-Pacific Regional Director, and confirmed that Reclamation did not intend to amend the Renewal Master Contract. A letter is being prepared to be signed by Mr. Rodgers binding Reclamation to the new interest rate. Ms Rees will follow up with Reclamation to request that Mr. Rodgers sign and forward the letter to COMB as soon as possible.

Operations Report – December 2006

Cachuma Project water usage for the month of December 2006 was 1,879 acrefeet, compared with 1,436 acre-feet for the same period in 2005. Cachuma Project water use for the 12 months ending 31 December 2006 was 25,231 acre-feet, compared with 28,118 acre-feet for the 12 months ending 31 December 2005.

The average flow from Lake Cachuma into the Tecolote Tunnel was 66 acre-feet per day. Lake elevation was 744.91 feet at the beginning of the month and 744.04 feet at the end. Recorded rainfall at Bradbury Dam was 1.59 inches for the month and 1.95 inches for the rainfall season, which commenced on July 1, 2006.

Santa Barbara wheeled 341 acre-feet of Gibraltar water through Lauro Reservoir during the month. 0 acre-feet of State Water Project water was wheeled through Cachuma Project facilities and delivered to South Coast Member Units during the month.

Structure rehabilitation continued this month with work on blow-off piping and lateral rehab planning. Staff has scheduled and is preparing for three system shutdowns in January through February. Work scheduled during these shutdowns includes the rehabilitation of two blow-offs and 9 laterals. This work will conclude all lateral, blow-off, and air vent rehabilitation on the upper reach of the South Coast Conduit, except for three structures that require major rehabilitation work beyond our current scope. This month parts were delivered to each site, structures were pumped of water, inventories of required tool were taken, needed tools were ordered, access was improved to several sites, and man-hoist attachment points were established at all sites in anticipation of next months structure rehab. Safety procedures, gas detectors, man harnesses, first-aid kits and 911 procedures were reviewed, calibrated and replenished. All preparation work was completed for the first system shutdown scheduled for the week of Monday January 8th.

Annual maintenance occurred on the COMB SCADA system. This work included inspection and review of all PLC's. The data registers were updated. New signals were directed for the inflow/outflow at Carpinteria Reservoir and the Carpinteria Valley Water District wells to the City of Santa Barbara. New batteries were ordered for UPS's at several sites. The inspection and review of the SCADA computer system will occur in February.

Staff continued the work on upgrading the Lauro Yard drain system. This project consists of upgrading portions of the existing system with new larger drain pipe and re-routing the drain system around congested areas. This month 150 feet of 18 drain pipe was installed along with 2 drop-inlets. In January the last drop-inlet will be installed and the system will be connected to the existing drainage system. This project is scheduled for completion and repaying in January.

Miscellaneous work completed this month includes:

- New network/phone lines were pulled from the Crew Shop to the trailers.
- 2 leaky fuel lines were replaced on the Posi-Track.
- Work continued on the COMB GIS system.

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 Ortega Reservoir discharge water samples were taken during the draining process and the annual report on discharge water quality was submitted to the Regional Water Quality Control Board.

Routine operation and maintenance activities conducted during the month included:

- Sample water at North Portal Intake Tower
- Complete Maintenance Management Program work orders
- Read anode rectifiers and monitor cathodic protection systems
- Monitor conduit right-of-way and respond to Dig Alert reports
- Read piezometers and underdrains at Glen Anne, Lauro and Ortega Dams
- Read meters, conduct monthly dam inspections, and flush venture meters

State Water Resources Control Board Water User Fees for FY 2006-2007

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Board of Directors ratify the action to pay the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) Water User Fees for the Cachuma Project for Fiscal Year 2006-2007 in the amount of \$21, 474.

Discussion:

Attached are two spreadsheets relating to the SWRCB Water User Fees for the Cachuma Project permits for FY 2006-2007.

One spreadsheet shows how the fees were calculated. As in past years, the SWRCB charges fees for each of the five Cachuma Project permits, even though the Santa Ynez River and Lauro Creek permits are multiple use permits. The SWRCB did not increase the fees this year, so the total amount owed for FY 2006-2007 was \$21, 474, which was same amount as FY 2005-2006.

The second spreadsheet shows how the fee cost is allocated by Member Unit, based on Cachuma entitlement percentages. All Member Units share the fee cost for the two permits for the Santa Ynez River, and the four South Coast member Units share the fee cost for the three permits for Glen Annie and Lauro.

The SWRCB was delayed in sending the bills this year. Consequently, we did not receive the bill from the County Water Agency until early December. Because the due date was December 18, 2006, COMB collected revenue from the Member Units and made the fee payment to the Board of Equalization before the payment due date. The Board is requested to ratify the action, acknowledging the payment amount.

Discussion:

Two documents are attached for your information. The first is the 1997-2005 Final Melded Rate Calculation. The reconciliation has been refined several times by Janet Gingras, COMB's Administrative Manager, with substantial input and review by the Member Unit Managers. The final formula used was discussed with the Board a few months ago, and the spreadsheet attached reflects overpayments and underpayments made by the Member Units using that formula. The debit or credit reconciliation will be made on the April 2007 bill for the second period water rate payments.

The second document is entitled Cachuma Project Water Ordering and Reporting Guidelines for Cachuma Operation and Maintenance Board. For several months, the Member Unit Managers have been developing guidelines for the COMB staff to more consistently and efficiently carry out the water accounting for Cachuma water orders and deliveries. These are only guidelines and do not represent a contract or contract amendment. They are for internal use only to assure that water accounting procedures are consistent from year to year.

Cachuma Project Water Ordering and Reporting Guidelines for Cachuma Operation and Maintenance Board December 2006

These guidelines are established by the Cachuma Operation and Maintenance Board (COMB) for the purpose of consistency and simplicity in ordering water and reporting actual water deliveries to the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) under the Cachuma Renewal Master Contract I75r-1802R between Reclamation and the Santa Barbara County Water Agency (SBCWA), and the Member Unit contracts with the SBCWA.

These are only guidelines, and do not represent a contract or contract amendment. It is recognized that individual Member Unit circumstances are unique and vary from year to year. Therefore, no set of guidelines will fit all cases. Their purpose is to assist the Member Units and COMB in discharging the responsibilities under the federal Renewal Master Contract and Member Unit contracts, and to ensure full benefit of the contract provisions for all.

Definition of Irrigation Water

For COMB accounting purposes only, Irrigation water shall be defined as the amount of Cachuma water delivered to eligible agricultural customers, with no reduction in that amount due to system losses, unaccounted-for water, evaporation or spill of Project water.

Ordering of Water

The Member Units will order their full Cachuma entitlements each year. All water will be ordered every year in advance of the water year (October 1 – Sept 30). For Member Units ordering Irrigation water, it is suggested that such water be ordered based upon a 5-year running average of agricultural customer sales for each water year.

Delivery and Reporting of Water

The Member Units will report to COMB each month the actual amount of Irrigation water delivered for the previous month. For accounting purposes, COMB will use its metered water use reports for each Member Unit to calculate the amount of M&I water used each month by subtracting the amount of Irrigation water delivered from the total amount of Cachuma water used. Annual reporting will be done prior to the 31st of October following the September 30th end of the previous water year. COMB will report to the SBCWA and Reclamation the actual water deliveries for both M&I and Irrigation water on a total Project basis as reported to them by the Member Units.

Melded Rates

Reclamation recalculates the Cachuma water rates each year to assure that the remaining capital cost of the Cachuma Project is paid off by 2015, as provided in the Renewal Master Contract. Because less of the irrigation component of the capital cost of the Project was paid off during the 40-year term of the original Master Contract, Reclamation's irrigation water rate in the Renewal Master Contract is substantially higher than the M&I water. To accomplish an internal adjustment is needed to make water rates equitable to both Irrigation and M&I users, and to minimize the total interest charges, the Member Units developed "melded rates" whereby the historic interest free use of the Project for irrigation is continued and the remainder of the required annual payment is covered by M&I water charges.

The melded rates will be calculated and billed to the Member Units using the percentage of Irrigation and M&I water ordered, considering the total capital debt remaining on the Project and the annual payments required by Reclamation under the Mid Pacific Region's rate setting policy. These values will be used by COMB to determine the initial melded rates on an annual basis.

Once the water year is complete, COMB will recalculate the melded rates using the percentage distribution of Irrigation and M&I water <u>actually</u> used. (See example on Page 3 below) The dollar differences for each Member Unit will then be applied as a credit or charge against the 2nd period water rates billing cycle each April. This adjustment will make whole the differences between Member Units that might occur due to the computation of internal melded rates based on water orders.

<u>Shortages</u> Description

In times of drought when Project storage drops below 100,000 acre feet, the Member Units may take shortages by ordering less than their full Cachuma entitlement. Reclamation will calculate the Cachuma water rates for that water year using this reduced amount so that full payment for the water year in which shortages are taken is still made in order to fully pay off the capital cost of the Project by 2015. This results in higher water rates for that year. Reclamation will not recalculate the water rates or payments due if it is later determined that there is unexpected water available later in the water year.

Carryover Water

COMB will calculate any carryover water as Project water. Carryover water will not be characterized as Irrigation or M&I water because Irrigation water cannot be determined until it is sold.

Surplus Spill Water

COMB will notify each Member Unit of the availability of surplus spill water, as determined by Reclamation, each year Lake Cachuma spills. COMB will report how much Irrigation and M&I water was delivered during each month of the spill event based on actual deliveries reported to COMB by each Member Unit.

Dear Mr. Hair:

We are writing in response to your proposed resolution confirming that the Santa Ynez River Water Conservation District, Improvement District No. 1 ("District") will not be held liable for the Cachuma Operations and Maintenance Board's ("COMB") obligations with respect to the Lauro Dam and Reservoir (Lauro Dam) contract with the United States ("Lauro Contract"). For the reasons set forth herein, we believe entering into an indemnification agreement is the appropriate method of establishing the parties' obligations.

The proposed resolution notes that the District - the only Santa Ynez Valley member of COMB - receives no benefit from the Lauro Contract. As such, the other member entities recognize that the District should not be obligated to contribute towards any of COMB's obligations under the Lauro Contract.

Several types of obligations arise under the Lauro Contract and under the law governing joint powers authorities ("JPAs"). The first type of obligation is the member agency's duty to pay the debts of the JPA. Under California law regulating JPAs, member entities of a JPA are liable for the contracts and debts of the JPA unless the JPA agreement specifically provides otherwise. (See, Gov't Code 6508.1; Tucker Land Co. v. California (2001) 94 Cal. App. 4th 1191, 1197 [upholding the plain meaning of Section 6508.1 and imposing no liability on member agencies where JPA specified they were not responsible for the debts of the JPA].) COMB's 1996 JPA agreement, at Sections 1.2 and 3.5(e), authorizes COMB to incur debt, liability and obligations in its own name and makes clear that doing so does not constitute the debts, liabilities, or obligations of the member agencies. Thus, the District is not directly liable for repaying the Lauro Contract.

While no further writing outside of the provisions existing in the JPA is necessary to disclaim the above obligation, the allocation of liability between the COMB members remains unsettled. The District has a general obligation as a member to contribute its pro-rata portion of COMB's debts. An agreement would be necessary to clarify that this general obligation is inapplicable to the District with respect to Lauro Dam. It is clear from the JPA that COMB has

the authority to modify the portions of payments that each member unit makes. (See, Article 1.1 [parties to JPA may agree to limit member units contributions of funds]; Article 4.2 [parties shall divide and pay the operations and maintenance costs according to their use of the facilities and their participation in the benefit thereof].) To achieve the agreed result, that all of the member agencies have already acknowledged as appropriate, the member agencies must enter into a separate agreement.

Another type of obligation is the member agency's responsibility for torts. Public entities that have joined under a JPA to perform some function, service or act are jointly and severally liable to injured persons if a tort is committed in performance of that function. (Gov't Code §§ 895; 895.2.) As a member of COMB, the District would be jointly and severally liable (up to its pro-rata proportion), as a member of COMB, if a financial or other liability were incurred with respect to Lauro Dam. However, the member entities can allocate among themselves the ultimate liability by providing for contribution and indemnification. (Gov't Code 895.4.) To avoid this liability with respect to the Lauro Project, and in particular the Lauro Contract, the District requires an indemnification agreement with COMB's member agencies.

You have proposed a resolution to demonstrate that the District will not be liable for COMB's obligations under the Lauro Contract. Resolutions typically constitute an expression of policy or opinion concerning some particular item of administrative business of the government entity. (See e.g., Sausalito v. County of Marin, 12 Cal. App. 3d 550, 565-66 (1970).) Resolutions are temporary in nature and remain in effect only until the resolution expires on its own terms or is modified or revoked by a subsequent resolution or action. (See, Am.Jur 2d §371; McQuillin on Municipal Corporations §15.2.) Thus, by its very nature the use of a resolution shows that COMB does not intend to create binding contractual rights that are enforceable in perpetuity. In other words, the resolution could be changed by a majority vote at any time. In addition, the proposed resolution does not indemnify the District for liability with respect to financial obligations and torts. For those reasons, we believe that an indemnification agreement is the appropriate vehicle to protect the District from financial and tort liability for the Lauro Contract and Lauro Dam Project. (See, San Joaquin County v. Stockton Swim Club 42 Cal.App.3d 968 (1974) [finding JPAs have the authority to enter into hold-harmless agreements as necessary.].)

In analyzing this issue, it has become apparent that COMB's initial authorization of the Lauro Contract did not meet the requirements of COMB's 1996 JPA. Section 1.3(h)(iv) thereof requires the unanimous consent of all of the parties for the Board to take action on the "issuance of bonds, notes, letters of credit or other forms of indebtedness in excess of one million (\$1,000,000.00) dollars." JPA also provides that:

A decision of the Cachuma Maintenance Operating Board authorizing a capital expenditure in excess of one million dollars or incurring an indebtedness or obligation in excess of one million dollars shall not be effective unless it has been ratified by a resolution approved by all of the parties.

(Section 1.3(i).) The Lauro Contract causes COMB to incur an obligation in excess of one million dollars. However, when the Board took action, it did not receive unanimous consent of all of the parties, nor did all of the parties ratify the action in a resolution. The District's representative was not present at the COMB Board meeting when this vote took place. As such, COMB's approval of the Lauro Contract is currently ineffective and must be reauthorized and, this time, it must receive unanimous consent. The District is willing to consent to the reauthorization of the Lauro Contract, contingent upon COMB and its members entering into an indemnification agreement.

The District's proposed indemnification agreement clarifying the District's exemption from liability under the Lauro Contract/Lauro Dam is enclosed for your review. We suggest that the COMB Board consider reauthorizing (ratifying) the Lauro Contract, which action must be contingent upon approval of the attached indemnification agreement. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to call.

INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

This Indemnification Agreement ("Agreement") is entered into this ______ day of ______, 2007, in the County of Santa Barbara, by and between the Cachuma Operations and Maintenance Board, a joint powers authority ("COMB"), Goleta Water District, City of Santa Barbara, Montecito Water District, Carpinteria Valley Water District and the Santa Ynez River Water Conservation District, Improvement District No. 1 ("ID#1"), with reference to the following facts and intentions:

- A. COMB has entered into or intends to enter into Contract No. 05-WC-20-2923 with the United States of America obligating COMB to repay to the United States of America a percentage of the funds expended by the United States of America in carrying out certain modifications to the Lauro Dam and Reservoir ("Lauro Dam Project") under the Federal Safety of Dams Act ("Lauro Contract");
- **B.** Lauro Dam and Reservoir is operated and maintained for the benefit of the four south coast members of COMB: Goleta Water District, City of Santa Barbara, Montecito Water District and Carpinteria Valley Water District ("South Coast Members");
- C. The 1996 Amended and Restated Agreement for the Establishment of a Board of Control to Operate and Maintain the Cachuma Project Cachuma Operations and Maintenance Board ("COMB Agreement") provides that each party's obligation for Cachuma Project operations and maintenance costs is expressly limited to the amount determined by its members;
- **D.** Under the COMB Agreement the member units divide and pay the operations and maintenance costs according to their proportionate use of and benefit from the facilities;
- E. ID#1, receives no benefit from the Lauro Contract or from the operation of the Lauro Dam and Reservoir; and
- F. The members of COMB and the COMB Board have determined and agree that ID#1 should not be obligated to pay any part of the obligations under Lauro Contract or otherwise be held responsible for the Lauro Dam Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. Allocation.

The parties agree, notwithstanding the general provisions of the COMB Agreement, that the South Coast Members shall be solely responsible for all of COMB's obligations, debts and liabilities related to the Lauro Dam Project including, but not limited to, the Lauro Contact, and that ID#1 shall not have any such responsibility or obligation.

2. Indemnification

To the maximum extent allowed by law, COMB hereby covenants and agrees, at the South Coast Members' sole and exclusive cost and expense, to defend, indemnify and hold

harmless ID#1, its officers, directors, agents and employees, from and against any and all damages, liabilities, claims, demands, actions, causes of action, attorneys' fees, expert witnesses fees, and all other costs and expenses of any kind or nature that arise out of or in any way relate to the Lauro Contract and/or the Lauro Dam Project. In the event of a court challenge to the legality or applicability of this indemnity provision, the parties agree that this indemnification provision shall be interpreted in favor of ID#1 and that ID#1 shall be afforded the maximum degree of indemnification as may be reasonably inferable from the language of this provision as available at law.

ID #1 shall notify COMB of the existence of any claim, demand, or other matter to which COMB's indemnification obligations would apply and shall give COMB a reasonable opportunity to defend the same at COMB's expense with counsel of COMB's own selection, subject to ID#1's reasonable approval. ID#1 may, at all times, participate in the defense at COMB's own expense. If COMB, within a reasonable time after written notice, fails to defend, ID#1 shall have the right, but not the obligation, to undertake the defense of, and to compromise our settlement (exercising reasonable business judgment), any claim or other matter on behalf, for the account, and at the risk of COMB and the South Coast Members.

- 3. Notices. All notices, approvals, acceptances, demands and other communications required or permitted under this Agreement, to be effective, shall be in writing and shall be delivered in person or by U.S. mail (postage prepaid, certified, return receipt requested) or by Federal Express or other similar overnight delivery service to the party to whom the notice is directed at the address of such party as maintained by COMB. Any written communication given by mail shall be deemed delivered two (2) business days after such mailing date and any written communication given by overnight delivery service shall be deemed delivered one (1) business day after the dispatch date. Either party may change its address by giving the other party written notice of its new address as provided above.
- 4. Other Instruments. The parties shall, whenever and as often as reasonably requested by the other party, execute, acknowledge and deliver or cause to be executed, acknowledged and delivered any and all documents and instruments as may be necessary, expedient or proper in the reasonable opinion of the requesting party to carry out the intent and purposes of this Agreement, provided that the requesting party shall bear the cost and expense of such further instruments or documents (except that each party shall bear its own attorneys' fees).
- 5. <u>Construction</u>. The provisions of this Agreement should be liberally construed to effectuate its purposes. The language of this Agreement shall be construed simply according to its plain meaning and shall not be construed for or against either party, as each party has participated in the drafting of this Agreement and had the opportunity to have their counsel review it. Whenever the context and construction so requires, all words used in the singular shall be deemed to be used in the plural, all masculine shall include the feminine and neuter, and vice versa.
- 6. <u>Severability.</u> If any term, provision, covenant or condition of this Agreement shall be or become illegal, null, void or against public policy, or shall be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, null or void or against public policy, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and shall not be affected, impaired or invalidated

thereby. The term, provision, covenant or condition that is so invalidated, voided or held to be unenforceable shall be modified or changed by the parties to the extent possible to carry out the intentions and directives stated in this Agreement.

- 7. <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> This Agreement shall be binding on and shall inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, legal representatives, successors and assigns.
- 8. <u>Waiver.</u> No waiver of any provision or consent to any action shall constitute a waiver of any other provision or consent to any other action, whether or not similar. No waiver or consent shall constitute a continuing waiver or consent or commit a party to provide a waiver in the future except to the extent specifically stated in writing. Any waiver given by a party shall be null and void if the party requesting such waiver has not provided a full and complete disclosure of all material facts relevant to the waiver requested. No waiver shall be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.
- 9. <u>Governing Law.</u> The validity and interpretation of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California without giving effect to the principles of conflict of laws, with venue for all purposes proper only in the County of Santa Barbara, State of California.
- 10. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original but all of which will constitute one and the same instrument. However, in making proof hereof, it will be necessary to produce only one copy hereof signed by the party to be charged.
- 11. <u>Joint and Several.</u> COMB and the South Coast Members shall be jointly and severally responsible for the obligations under this Agreement. This Agreement may be enforced by ID#1 against either COMB or the South Coast Members separately or against them jointly.
- 12. Attorneys' Fees. If any action at law or equity, including an action for declaratory relief, is brought to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover actual attorneys' fees and costs which may be determined by the court in the same action or in a separate action brought for that purpose. The attorneys' fees and costs to be awarded shall be made to fully reimburse for all attorneys' fees, paralegal fees, costs and expenses actually incurred in good faith, regardless of the size of the judgment, it being the intention of the parties to fully compensate for all attorneys' fees, paralegal fees, costs and expenses paid or incurred in good faith.
- 13. <u>Authorizations.</u> All individuals executing this Agreement and other documents on behalf of the respective parties certify and warrant that they have the capacity and have been duly authorized to so execute the documents on behalf of the entity so indicated. Each signatory shall also indemnify the other parties to this Agreement, and hold them harmless, from any and all damages, costs, attorneys' fees and costs and other expenses, if the signatory is not so authorized.
- 14. Entire Agreement and Amendment. This Agreement contains the entire understanding and agreement of the parties and there have been no promises, representations, agreements, warranties or undertakings by any of the parties, either oral or written, of any character or nature binding except as stated in this Agreement. This Agreement may be altered, amended or

modified only by an instrument in writing, executed by the parties to this Agreement and by no other means. Each party waives their right to claim, contest or assert that this Agreement was modified, canceled, superseded or changed by any oral agreement, course of conduct, waiver or estoppel.

COMB/CCRB Proposed Reorganization

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Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

Matt Loudon and I recently met with our General Manager, Chris Dahlstrom, to receive an update from the November 27th managers and attorneys meeting with Mr. Jostes concerning the reorganization. We were pleased that the two agency alternative was finally discussed, as previously directed by both the CCRB and COMB Boards of Directors. Unfortunately, there were some troubling aspects of that meeting.

First, we do not understand why two attorneys from COMB's general counsel firm, Mr. Hair and Mr. Trembley, were present at the meeting. It seems that one attorney would have been more than sufficient for the meeting. They are not active participants and merely there to respond to questions about legal aspects of the reorganization related to COMB. In fact, at this meeting, nothing substantive was raised that even required legal input from them. Their presence at the meeting cost COMB (its members) an additional and unnecessary expense of at least one attorney attending a 3 hour meeting plus 1-1/2 to 2 hours travel time. It seems that at a time when many member agencies are raising issues concerning COMB and CCRB costs with respect to which reorganization alternative is best, everyone should be paying closer attention to the operations now and not just after the reorganization, if it occurs at all. In the future, it is the ID No.1 Board's on-going opinion that this reorganization only involve COMB's general counsel at meetings when it is anticipated that his legal input will be needed for COMB matters.

More disconcerting was a disparaging remark made by Mr. Hair about the ID No. 1. Mr. Hair referred to the District as the "White Elephant" in the room that was causing significant

problems with the reorganization process. This is the second time his remark has been expressed which was done previously at a joint COMB/CCRB Board meeting. This Board takes great exception to Mr. Hair's comment. ID No.1 has been a member of COMB since its inception and contributed significantly to the success of COMB and its goals and objectives. After hearing this comment, the District has grave reservations about the impartiality of Mr. Hair and his firm. Mr. Hair represents COMB, the agency, and not any individual member agency. He should not be expressing any views in favor or against any member agency. Any disagreement between the individual member agencies must be resolved between the involved agencies. Mr. Hair, in his apparent favoring of the other member agencies over the ID No.1, bring to question his conduct and representation of COMB.

ID No.1 must have this issue addressed at the next COMB Board meeting and will seek legal advise from our counsel as to the Rules of Professional Conduct. At the very least, the ID No.1 expects to receive a written apology from Mr. Hair as well as confirmation that his firm only represents COMB, the agency, and that his firm is neutrality with respect to matters that may arise between the member agencies.

Thank you for your consideration of this matter.
