#### 1. Call to Order, Roll Call

The meeting was called to order at 4:07 p.m. by President Williams who chaired the meeting. Those in attendance were:

Director Lieberknecht moved to approve the consent agenda as presented, seconded by Director Hanson, 7/0/0.

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There was a request to move Agenda Item #4 Reports from the Manager to the end of the meeting in order to consider Resolution No. 501 earlier in the meeting. Director Hanson so moved, seconded by Director Lieberknecht, passed 7/0/0.

- 6. Consider Resolution No. 501 to Approve the COMB 2010 Revenue Bond and Related Legal Documents and Agreements for the SCC Upper Reach Reliability Project (2<sup>nd</sup> Pipeline Project)
  - a. Comb Indenture of Trust
  - b. Goleta Water District Joint Participation Agreement
  - c. City of Santa Barbara Joint Participation Agreement
  - d. COMB Purchase Contract Citigroup Global Markets, Inc.
  - e. COMB Continuing Disclosure Agreement Bank of New York Mellon Trust Company, N.A.
  - f. COMB Preliminary Official Statement
  - g. Montecito Water District Contribution Agreement

Ms. Rees reported that ID No. 1 and COMB had executed a Memorandum of Understanding to curtail any activities in the Santa Ynez River by COMB until December 31, 2010 in order to complete the organizational restructuring of COMB and CCRB. As a result, ID No. 1 approved COMB's bond, and was the last of the five Member Units to do so. Staff recommended that COMB approve Resolution No. 501 to issue a COMB bond for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Pipeline Project, and approve all legal documents and related agreements.

#### Director Morgan moved to:

- 1. Approve COMB Resolution No. 501 authorizing COMB to proceed with the issuance of \$11M in bonds to finance the construction of the South Coast Conduit (SCC) Upper Reach Reliability Project (2<sup>nd</sup> Pipeline Project). All bond proceeds and obligations will be for the benefit of COMB, the City of Santa Barbara (City) and the Goleta Water District (GWD).
- 2. Approve, in substantially the same form, the Montecito Water District (MWD) Contribution Agreement whereby MWD commits to self-funding up to 13.1% of the total cost for the SCC Upper Reach Reliability Project.
- 3. Approve the Bond Indemnification Agreement whereby Montecito Water District (MWD), Carpinteria Valley Water District (CVWD), and Santa Ynez River Water Conservation District, ID No. 1 (ID No. 1) will not be held

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responsible or obligated in any way for the COMB bond contractual obligations.

4. Authorize the sale of the bonds, but not until after construction bids are received and a contractor is selected and approved by COMB and the Member Units.

Seconded by Director Hanson.

Sarah Knecht requested that the language of recommendation No. #4 be revised to say:

"Authorize the sale of the bonds, contingent upon receiving the construction bids and approval of a contractor by COMB and the Member Units.

Also that recommendation No. #1 be revised to say:

"Approve COMB Resolution No. 501 authorizing COMB to proceed with the issuance of, **not to exceed** \$11M in bonds to finance the construction of the South Coast Conduit (SCC) Upper Reach Reliability Project (2<sup>nd</sup> Pipeline Project). All bond proceeds and obligations will be for the benefit of COMB, the City of Santa Barbara (City) and the Goleta Water District (GWD)".

Ms. Knecht also requested that the schedule reflects all of the dates for approvals. Ms. Rees said that it would be updated.

Director Morgan revised his motion to include those conditions; Director Hanson also agreed to the conditions in her second.

7. If Necessary, Consider Assignment of Proposition 50 Subgrant Agreement Between COMB and the County Water Agency to the City of Santa Barbara for Construction of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Pipeline Project and Receipt of Proposition 50 Grant Funds, Contingent Upon Approval of All Related Agreements and Permits

This was not necessary to consider.

8. Consider Approval of 2010 MOU to Participate in Proposition 84 Grant Funding and revision of Santa Barbara Countywide IRWMP

This was fully discussed during the CCRB meeting and there was nothing more to add.

Director Morgan moved to approve a 2010 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to continue participation in the state-wide Proposition 84 process, apply for a planning grant, and update the Santa Barbara Countywide integrated Regional Water

 Management Plan (IRWMP), contingent upon the County Board of Supervisors approving the 2010 MOU, including its approval of funding approximately 50% of the administrative costs and authorize payment of approximately \$7,800 each for CCRB and COMB's contribution to the administrative costs for the 2010 MOU activities, seconded by Director Hanson, passed 6/0/1, Director Bettencourt abstained.

# 9. Status of ID No. 1's Consideration of Amendment to the COMB Joint Powers Agreement to Modify the Unanimous Approval Provision for Obligations or Projects in Excess of \$1,000,000

At the February 22<sup>nd</sup> Board meeting, an amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) was proposed to modify the unanimous approval provision for projects in excess of \$1,000,000, so that only those Member Units paying or a project would need to unanimously approve it. Director Bettencourt agreed to discuss this with his Board. If ID No. 1 agreed to this amendment, it would then be considered by the other Member Unit Boards. Director Bettencourt reported that the ID No. 1 Board would not support any such modification to the JPA at this time. They did agree to move forward with restructuring COMB, and thought this modification might be addressed during that process.

#### 5. Reports From the Manager

a. Cachuma Water Reports

These reports were included in the board packet.

#### b. Operations Report

The Operations Report was included in the board packet. Director Morgan requested a break down of materials/labor cost for the plantings around Lauro Reservoir in a future report.

#### c. COMB Operating Committee

The approved minutes from the February 3, 2010 meeting were included in the board packet. Director Morgan requested that the current month's Operating Committee minutes be included in the board packet to avoid a delay in receiving the information from those meetings. After discussion it was decided that the Operating Committee minutes would be included in draft form in future.

## d. Executed MOU Between COMB and ID No. 1 to Limit Activities During Organizational Restructuring

A copy of the fully executed MOU between COMB and ID No. 1 was included in the board packet for information.

Director Bettencourt stated that the ID No. 1 Board was pleased that the MOU had been approved by both Boards and hoped to see the restructuring proceed in a timely manner.

e. Quagga Mussel Inspection Report – County of Santa Barbara
Included in the board packet was the report from the County Parks
Department on the Quagga mussel inspection program at Lake Cachuma.

#### f. Proposition 50 and 84 Activities

Included in the board packet were meeting agendas and a schedule for the Prop 84 project selection process. Ms. Rees reported that notification had been received that the SWRCB had removed the Prop 50 funding suspension after reviewing the Corrective Action letter from the County. Invoices will now be reimbursed to each project participant.

Submittal of New Applications for ARRA Funding to Reclamation g. Included in the board packet were three applications resubmitted by COMB staff for American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Funding (ARRA) from Reclamation's stimulus package. Reclamation may have funds available from projects initially awarded ARRA funding that will not be able to be constructed before the deadline to use the money.

#### **Operations Report – March 2010**

The average flow from Lake Cachuma into the Tecolote Tunnel for March was 34 acre-feet per day. Lake elevation was 743.39 feet at the beginning of the month and 746.08 feet at the end. 54 acre-feet of State Water Project water was wheeled through Cachuma Project facilities and delivered to South Coast Member Units during the month.

Conditions at Ortega Reservoir have remained consistent over the month, with weekly monitoring of drain flow, piezometer elevations and site conditions.

#### Other activities conducted this month include:

- Jesusita Fire recovery efforts at Lauro Reservoir during March continued with the planting of acorns at 100 sites to meet mitigation requirements for the Lauro Retention Basin project at Lauro Reservoir. Honeysuckle mitigation requirements for the project were also met with the planting of 65 Santa Barbara Honeysuckle on the south side of Lauro Retention Basin. Associated field maintenance and monitoring to meet the performance criteria for the oak trees and honeysuckle is under contract with a contractor experienced with meeting mitigation requirements, and supervised by COMB.
- Carpinteria Reservoir was de-watered and cleaned in a collaborative effort between the COMB Operations Crew and Carpinteria Valley Water District employees. The cleaning effort took approximately two weeks, and after disinfection was put back into service with no disruption in service to customers.
- Progress continued on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Pipeline. A complete status of the project is included in the board packet for the April COMB board meeting.

Routine operation and maintenance activities conducted during the month included:

- Sampled water at North Portal Intake Tower
- Monitored conduit right-of-way and responded to Dig Alert reports
- Read piezometers and underdrains at Glen Anne, Lauro and Ortega Dams
- Read meters, conducted monthly dam inspections, and flushed venturi meters
- Weed abatement and spraying efforts at COMB facilities at Glen Annie, Carpinteria, Ortega and Lauro Reservoirs.

Rebecca indicated that the salaries for all comparable City positions should be reduced be 10%.

- After discussion on account 6062, SCADA, it was suggested that only the feasibility engineering study to design the radio system be included, resulting in a budget reduction. John requested staff to quantify the 30% signal losses currently experiencing with telephone lines resulting in SCADA down time and additional technical consultant time needed to troubleshoot and repair the problem, as well as the staff time to manually make system changes.
- After discussion on account 6092, SCC Improvement Plan & Design, it was suggested that the Reliability Study for Reach #4 be deferred to FY 2011-12, resulting in a budget reduction. It was also requested that an emergency response plan be developed and added to this item.
- After discussion on account 6097, GIS and Mapping, the detailed cost breakdown was reviewed, and the only reduction suggested was to eliminate staff attendance at the annual ESRI conference. It was agreed that attendance will be determined by General Manager depending on if any of the conference topics would be of benefit to staff. This may result in a possible budget reduction.
- After discussion on account 3303, Reservoir Cleaning, it was determined that there will be no need to clean Carpinteria Reservoir next year. Therefore, the budget will be reduced to reflect the cost for cleaning Ortega Reservoir only.
- The Sanitary Survey will be described in the budget as not a COMB activity, but that the Member Units agreed to conduct it through COMB. The City of Lompoc will be contacted to see if they wish to participate as in prior surveys. If they do, they must contribute their normal percentage of the cost. If not, Frick Springs will be removed from the survey.
- Janet will provide a full explanation to the Board regarding OPEB.
- John recommended that 75% of the General Manager's salary be included in the COMB budget in the event that CCRB is dissolved Jan 1, 2011. Currently Kate's salary is split equally between CCRB and COMB.

#### c. Draft Encroachment Permit Application and Permit

d. Process to Address County-Member Unit Issues

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Kate will be the lead in the discussions with County staff. She will schedule a meeting with Terri Naus-Nisich, Deputy CEO, to develop a process for addressing outstanding County-Member Unit issues. The issues will be identified, priorities set, and appropriate people be identified to participate in the discussions depending on the topic. All issues will be thoroughly reviewed with the Cachuma General Managers for their input throughout the discussions.

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

RE: Encroachment Permit Program

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

- 1. Approve implementation of a COMB Encroachment Permit Program for encroachments within the South Coast Conduit right-of-way or on federal land at Glen Annie, Lauro, Ortega, and Carpinteria Reservoirs.
- 2. Approve application and permit forms in substantially the same form as attached.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The location of the South Coast Conduit (SCC) roughly follows the base of the foothills from Goleta to Carpinteria, a distance of about 26 miles. The Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) purchased right of way easements along the entire length of the SCC and the land in fee around the four balancing reservoirs, Glen Annie, Lauro, Ortega, and Carpinteria. At the time the Cachuma Project was built, there was very little development in the foothill area. However, today the SCC passes through some of the most expensive real estate in Santa Barbara.

Over the years, there have been many encroachments with within the SCC right of way. But until very recently, COMB was not notified of these encroachments by the County or the City of Santa Barbara when property owners applied for building permits for construction within the easements. Of course, there have been many projects completed without permits, such as driveways, fences, gates, swimming pools, etc.

COMB's Transfer of Operation and Maintenance Agreement with Reclamation required that property owners wishing to build within the SCC easement submit an application for an encroachment permit to Reclamation, and if there was no impact to the SCC, Reclamation has historically issued these permits. COMB did the initial impact evaluation and made its recommendation to Reclamation whether it should be granted or not. But the encroachment permits were issued by the federal government.

Several years ago, Reclamation informed COMB that they could not withhold an encroachment permit for construction activities within the SCC easements because the landowner owned the underlying property. COMB disagreed with Reclamation's position that encroachment permits

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should be automatically granted, and that approval should depend on the proposed activity and what potential impact it may have to the integrity of the SCC. Reclamation said it had no objection to COMB assuming the authority to issue or deny encroachment permits through the terms of the Transfer of Operation and Maintenance Agreement.

Nothing has been done for several years regarding encroachments within the SCC right-of-way. However, the City and County now have the SCC easement marked on all property documented and will not issue building permits unless and until an encroachment permit is approved for the proposed activity. COMB is also beginning the process of defining a Right-of-Way Definition Program in order to map the location of the fill length of the SCC on a GIS map, with parcel boundaries and property owners overlain on the map. Illegal encroachments that are discovered will also be documented.

Therefore, it is time to reestablish an Encroachment Permit process and for COMB to issue the permits rather than Reclamation. We have received formal authorization from Reclamation. Attached is a draft encroachment permit application and draft encroachment permits that have been developed for COMB's use. The overall process will be the same as in the past when Reclamation was the permitting agency. Staff recommends that the Board approve the recommendations.

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### **General Encroachment Permit Guidelines**

- 1. PERMISSION. Permittee is authorized to construct, operate, maintain, and repair the Improvements on the Real Property.
- 2. LIMITATIONS ON ENCROACHMENT. Permittee is permitted to construct only the Improvements that are described and shown on Exhibit B, subject to the conditions contained in Exhibit C. Permittee shall have the right to access the Improvements at all times and to the extent necessary during an emergency condition without prior approval from COMB. Permittee will advise COMB as soon as possible of the nature of the emergency condition, the cause, if known, and the proposed actions to be taken to correct the emergency. Further, the Permittee shall have the rights retained by it in its grant of the Real Property to COMB to construct, reconstruct, repair, and/or change the size of the improvements in the Real Property with the prior written consent of COMB, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, provided that the Permittee obtain an Encroachment Permit for any improvements not included in this or any other Encroachment Permit. Reconstruction of, or additions or extensions to, the Improvements require COMB's advance written consent.
- 3. ACCEPTANCE OF PROVISIONS. Permittee understands and accepts the conditions contained herein and in any attachments hereto.
- 4. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW. Permittee shall comply with all applicable Federal, State, and local laws and regulations.
- 5. PERMITS. Prior to beginning construction, Permittee shall obtain all other approvals and permits required by law from any public agencies that have jurisdiction.
- 6. AUTOMATIC TERMINATION. This Encroachment Permit shall terminate automatically at any time Permittee abandons or removes the Improvements. If Permittee only abandons or removes a portion of the Improvements, this Encroachment Permit shall terminate as to the portion that is abandoned or removed.
- 7. NOTICE PRIOR TO STARTING WORK. At least seven (7) days prior to starting work, Permittee shall notify COMB's General Manager in writing. Said notice may be evidenced by email, facsimile, or in writing to the General Manager at the address specified at the end of said Encroachment Permit.



# INSTRUCTIONS FOR ENCROACHMENT PERMIT APPLICATION DRAFT

#### Cachuma Operation & Maintenance Board

Per California Government Code 4216, anyone planning to excavate in proximity to existing subsurface utilities must notify the Regional Notification Center (Utility Service Alert) prior to excavating. If the new work is to conflict with existing utilities, the exact location of the utilities is to be determined by excavation (pothole) in cooperation with the Cachuma Operation & Maintenance Board (COMB) prior to new construction.

USA South (Santa Barbara County) 811

- 1 An Encroachment Application is required for anyone doing work in or on the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation/ Cachuma Operation & Maintenance Board (USBR/COMB) Right of Way, operated and maintained by COMB.
- 2 COMB has the authority to issue Encroachment Permits through its Transfer of Operation and Maintenance Ageement with USBR.
- 3 Fill out the appropriate permit application and provide the attachments listed below if the project is within the Right of Way for the South Coast Conduit (SCC). The application can be downloaded from COMB's website. <a href="http://www.cachuma-board.org">http://www.cachuma-board.org</a>
- 4 The COMB permit package shoul include the following:

COMB Encroachment Permit Application
Deposit (\$400 for installation of one utility, and \$100 for each additional utility, min. \$200 for review of
drawings if no utilities are installed.)
Copy of Assessor's Parcel legal description (Available on Title or through County Recorder's Off.)
Name, address and phone number of Parcel Owner
Contact for project: Name, address, and phone numbers of Contractors engaged in the project.
5 copies of project drawings (include profile showing clearances between SCC facilities and new work)
Evidence of environmental compliance (DFG Negative Declaration or Environmental Mitigation Plan), when applicable
Certificate of Insurance: Parcel Owner performing new work - \$1 million dollars General Liability coverage
Contractor working in ROW - \$1 million Commercial General Liability Insurance
(COMB must be added by endorsement as an additional insured)

#### NOTE:

When a "pothole" excavation is necessary, COMB may issue a Temporary Permit strictly for use to determine the precise location of SCC facilities before the Encroachment Permit is approved.

- 5 Within 2 weeks of receipt of an encroachment permit application, COMB staff will contact you to let you know the status of the permit, and whether any further information is needed.
- 6 Regarding the deposit, COMB will return any unspent funds upon receipt of a letter noting completion of the project, along with final as built drawings. If no such letter and drawings are submitted within 6 months of COMB activity on the project, then the remainder of the deposit shall be forfeited to COMB.
